
-clipboards -pencils -Estuary Bingo sheets (version 1-4) -stamp/stamp pad


Lesson:

Take students on a guided natural scavenger hunt to find a variety of terrestrial and aquatic native plants and animals. Hand out a different version of the bingo sheet to each or a pair of students. Begin by asking students if there is anything on their bingo sheet that is generally unfamiliar. If so, explain the item. Describe that although an estuary is where fresh and salt water meet, there is both wetland and upland habitat and that your guided walk will take you to both. As students come across the items on their bingo sheet, have them X or check the box. Make it fun by trying to get 3 in a row. Extend the hunt to get black out bingo.


